





5.1.5 Amendments (AM) to motions for a draft resolution (RD) and motions for a resolution (RE) tabled in committee (with SDL Studio)


1. Monolingual source language documents

Step:	Action:	Tool:
1.	<p>The TMX file containing standard translations for the amendment headings has been imported into the Normative Studio Memory (Normative TM).</p> <p>The TMX file for the standard phrases <i>Normative_Main</i>¹ and the TMX file for the draft resolution (RD) or resolution (RE) to which amendments are tabled have been imported into the Basic Reference Studio Memory (BRTM).</p>	 SDL Studio
2.	<p>The Normative TM has been used to pre-translate the original document at 98% and the BRTM has been used to pre-translate it at 100% in order to get the translation for the amendment headings, the DocEP text of the cover page and the RD/RE document text from the left-hand column. Use this pre-translated SDLXLIFF file (*BR.docx.sdlxliff) for all further steps².</p> <p>Check that all the pre-translated segments (including those marked as 100%) are correct and complete the translation of the amendment headings using the Normative TM and that of the left-hand column using the BRTM.</p>	 SDL Studio
3.	<p>The TMX files for the RD or RE, all the EP documents that belong to the procedure, the <i>Normative_Main</i> and the Retrieval results have been imported into the Working Studio Memory (WTM).</p> <p>If you received additional TMX files for reference material not included in the project, import these files into the WTM.</p> <p>Enable the WTM and use it to complete the translation of the document. Save the file frequently.</p>	 SDL Studio
4.	<p>While interactively translating in Studio, mark the differences between the left-hand column and the right-hand column in <i>Bold and Italic</i>³.</p>	 SDL Studio

5.	DELIVER A BILINGUAL SDLXLIFF FILE (OR A STANDARD BILINGUAL XLIFF FILE) ⁴ .	 SDL Studio

2. Multilingual source language documents

1.	<p>The TMX file containing standard translations for the amendment headings has been imported into the Normative Studio Memory (Normative TM).</p> <p>The TMX file for the standard phrases <i>Normative_Main</i>⁵ and the TMX file for the draft resolution (RD) or resolution (RE) to which amendments are tabled have been imported into the Basic Reference Studio Memory (BRTM).</p>	 SDL Studio
2.	<p><i>N.B.: In document type AM, all AM headings in the original document are usually in English.</i></p> <p>Open the EN-Target Language pre-translated package. It contains the original multilingual document pre-translated with the Normative TM in order to get the standard translation for each amendment heading and the DocEP text of the cover page. Use this pre-translated SDLXLIFF file (*Normative.docx.sdlxliff) for all further steps⁶.</p> <p>Check that all the pre-translated standard segments are correct and complete the translation of the amendment headings using the Normative TM.</p>	 SDL Studio
3.	<p>Convert the *Normative.docx.sdlxliff back to Word and split the document source language-wise using DocEP AM Split⁷.</p>	 MS Word 
4.	<p>Follow the steps below for each SL-TL project.</p> <p>Add each split document to the corresponding SL-TL Studio project.</p> <p>At this stage, the source language column in SDL Studio Editor already contains the DocEP text of the cover page and the amendment headings in the target language. Change the status of those segments to <i>'locked'</i> and leave the corresponding target language cells empty⁸.</p>	 SDL Studio

	<p>Use the BRTM to pre-translate the TL document at 100% in order to get the RD or RE document text into the left-hand column⁹. (<i>N.B.: the matches are 100% correct from the contents point of view but they lack all formatting.</i>)</p> <p>Check that all the pre-translated segments (including those marked as 100%) are correct and complete the translation of the left-hand column using the BRTM.</p>	
5.	<p>The TMX files for the RD/RE, all the EP documents that belong to the procedure, the <i>Normative_Main</i> and the Retrieval results have been imported into the Working Studio Memory (WTM).</p> <p>If you received additional TMX files for reference material not included in the projects, import these files into the WTM.</p> <p>Enable the WTM and use it to complete the translation of the document. Save the file frequently.</p>	 <p>SDL Studio</p>
6.	<p>While interactively translating in Studio, mark the differences between the left-hand column and the right-hand column in <i>Bold and Italic</i>¹⁰.</p>	 <p>SDL Studio</p>
7.	<p>DELIVER A BILINGUAL SDLXLIFF FILE (OR A STANDARD BILINGUAL XLIFF FILE) FOR EACH SL-TL COMBINATION (INCLUDING THE PIV-TL, IF APPLICABLE)¹¹.</p>	 <p>SDL Studio</p>
8.	<p>Generate a Word file for each SL-TL split. Assemble the splits to create the final TL document with DocEP <i>AM Plus</i>. Run DocEP <i>Change Document ID</i>.</p> <p>DELIVER AN MS WORD DOCUMENT¹².</p>	 <p>MS Word</p>
